



**Report of the Water Commissioners
of The
North Raynham Water District
May 23, 2019**

To the Citizens of the North Raynham Water District

The Commissioners of the North Raynham Water District respectfully submit the following report of the operation and financial statement.

Three new services were installed giving the District 1,413 active services.

The District pumped a total of 103,248,000 gallons of water during 2018. The District received 12,300,000 from Raynham Center Water District during the Wilbur St tank painting project. A separate Water Quality Report will be mailed to all customers by the North Raynham Water District. Thank you to the Raynham Center Water District for their help and support.

The Treasurer's report shows the District to be in sound financial condition. This has been confirmed by the independent auditor's report from Marcum Accountants LLP for the Fiscal Year 2018.

The System Development and the District's Money Market Accounts, Certificates of Deposits and Capital Savings Accounts have yielded a total of \$28,911.00 in interest for Fiscal Year 2018

The Demand Fees for new water installations generated \$13,980.00 for the Fiscal Year 2018. The System Development Fees generated \$34,717.00 for the Fiscal Year 2018.

District Annual Water Quality Reports

The annual water quality reports will be mailed to each resident by the required Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) July 1st deadline.

Major Infrastructure Changes

The District has painted and repaired the Wilbur Street Standpipe. This project was completed on September 15, 2018. Pictures have been posted on the District website @ www.nrw.d.org

New Meter Replacement Program

The District is continuing a system wide meter replacement program, installing the new radio read meters. District employees will be going door to door asking residents to allow entry to replace the old style meters. There is no charge for this change out. **Please call for an appointment @ 508-824-0520.** The District has replaced over 44 meters during 2018 bringing the total number of meters replaced to 869, which represents 67.5% of residential accounts. This increases the accuracy of water readings which helps to reduce the districts unaccounted for water and lowers the tax rate due to more accurate consumption billing

Water Exploration

The District continues to look for viable sites for development and will make updates available as testing progresses.
